If you answer yes to the following questions (and if you are a resident of the Greater Toronto Region), you should apply to be a 2010 DiverseCity Fellow:

1. Have you worked on city-building initiatives that aim to make a positive change in our region?
2. Are you committed to engaging and leveraging the Greater Toronto Region's diverse cultures, perspectives, and experiences?
3. Are you willing to push yourself to grow as a leader?
4. Are you eager to build and maintain collaborative relationships with new people from a range of sectors in order to contribute to Toronto's future?
5. Are you willing and able to commit to a 12-month fellowship (January-December 2010), including one overnight retreat, ten full-day sessions, plus independent development of a city-building project (outside of professional work)?

Application and selection process

About DiverseCity Fellows

DiverseCity Fellows is a one-year action-oriented fellowship program for 25 rising city-builders who are deeply committed to developing themselves into better leaders and working across sectors on issues that are critical to the future health and wealth of the Toronto region.

The DiverseCity Fellows program takes a learning-by-doing approach. By connecting and supporting rising city-builders today, the program aims to:

- Create a civic leadership that reflects the diversity of the Toronto region;
- Advance the strategic capacity of city-building leaders as they strive to effect positive change, and;
- Develop a new kind of leadership, one that values diverse perspectives and operates across sectors.

Over the course of a year, Fellows participate in innovative and provocative workshops on leadership development, diversity, and civic awareness. DiverseCity Fellows connects rising leaders to influencers and decision-makers across the GTA. The program culminates with the design and implementation of city-building action projects that Fellows develop with partner institutions.

DiverseCity Fellows 2010 will run from January-December 2010 and includes one overnight retreat, ten full-day sessions, plus independent development of a city-building project (outside of professional work).

DiverseCity Fellows is part of DiverseCity: The Greater Toronto Leadership Project, an initiative of the Toronto City Summit Alliance and Maytree.
